WHAT THIS CHAPTER IS, IN PLAIN ENGLISH

Your child is learning what HUMAN GEOGRAPHY is — the study of how humans and the natural environment interact, and how human activities (cities, villages, economies, cultures) are distributed across the earth's surface. They learn three competing schools of thought about whether environment determines human society or humans shape their environment, and the wide scope of human geography across many subfields.

5 QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR CHILD

- Define human geography in your own words.
- What's the difference between environmental determinism and possibilism?
- Who proposed neo-determinism? What does 'stop-and-go' mean?
- List 5 subfields of human geography.
- How is human geography different from sociology?

WEAK-SPOT INDICATORS

- Confuses which thinker is associated with which school.
- Cannot state what 'stop-and-go determinism' means.
- Lists only 2-3 subfields when asked for 5+.
- Confuses naturalisation of humans with humanisation of nature.
