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WHAT THIS CHAPTER IS, IN PLAIN ENGLISH

Your child is learning about the great religious changes in early India between roughly 600 BCE and 600 CE — a thousand-year period when many new thinkers questioned the Vedic rituals and the caste order. The chapter centres on the BUDDHA (Siddhartha Gautama), his Four Noble Truths and Eightfold Path, the Sangha (the order of monks and nuns), and the parallel rise of JAINISM under MAHAVIRA — with its strict non-violence (ahimsa) and the doctrine that truth has many sides (anekantavada). 5 QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR CHILD

- What are the Four Noble Truths of the Buddha? What is the Eightfold Path?
- Who was Mahavira, and what are the five vows of a Jaina monk?
- Name the parts of a stupa. Why is Sanchi famous?
- What is anekantavada? Why does it matter?
- Who deciphered the Brahmi script, and how? Why did Sanchi survive while Amaravati did not?

WEAK-SPOT INDICATORS

- Cannot list all four Noble Truths or all eight steps of the Eightfold Path.
- Confuses the Three Jewels of Buddhism (Buddha-Dhamma-Sangha) with the Triratna of Jainism (right faith-knowledge-conduct).
- Cannot label the parts of a stupa (anda, harmika, yashti, torana).
- Treats the Buddha as a Hindu god from the start, or confuses Buddhism with Jainism.
- Forgets Sanchi vs Amaravati / James Prinsep / Brahmi 1837.

WHEN TO WORRY — AND WHAT TO DO

Class 12 History rewards SPECIFICS — names (Prinsep, H.H. Cole, Begums of Bhopal), terms (anda, harmika, anekantavada, Triratna), and dates (1837 for Brahmi, c. 563-483 BCE for the Buddha). Vague answers fail. A daily 15-minute term-and-diagram drill for 3 weeks is the proven fix.

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
